Historical Note

Cathedral College was opened in September 1903. The plans for the college were begun under Archbishop Michael Corrigan, who passed away before the school could be open. His successor, then-Archbishop John Farley, completed the necessary steps for the opening of the school, and appointed then-Msgr. Patrick Hayes as the school's first president. The original location of the school was on Madison Avenue and 51st Street, the site of the former Roman Catholic Orphan Asylum, which had relocated to the Kingsbridge neighborhood of the Bronx. As Msgr. Hayes was also the chancellor of the diocese, the school building was also the home of the Chancery offices and the Propagation of the Faith. The school was a 6-year program, with a strong emphasis on vocation formation, with the end goal that the students would then move on to the archdiocese's major seminary at Dunwoodie. Although it was standard for students of minor seminary programs to board, Archbishop Farley did not think that was appropriate, and so students commuted daily.

By the 1940s, the school had outgrown its current location, and plans were made to move to 87th Street and West End Avenue. The first classes were held in the new location in September of 1942. Although the school had always had a preparatory department, it wasn't until 1968 that the preparatory and minor seminary programs were split. Due to declining enrollments and vocations, plans were made to move the Cathedral College out to the Cathedral College of the Immaculate Conception in Douglaston, New York (on Long Island), where it would merge with the Dioceses of Brooklyn and Rockville Centre. Cathedral Preparatory Seminary continued on as a free-standing, four-year high school program.

In 1989, Cathedral College at Douglaston closed. In 1992, Cathedral Prep moved from the West Side of Manhattan to Rye, New York, and in 1998 the Prep was converted from a fouryear standalone high school program to a formation program. Students in the program attend other Catholic high schools while taking part in the formation aspects of Cathedral Prep.

Scope & Content Note

The bulk of this collection consists of material relating to the administration of Cathedral College and Cathedral Preparatory Schools, both pre-seminary programs within the Archdiocese of New York. The majority of the material was created by the school itself, either for in-house use or for publicity purposes, with the bulk of the material dating to the 1960s. There is not a lot of material on the formation of the school—for that, users might look to the John Cardinal Farley or Archbishop Michael Corrigan collections. The move of Cathedral College to Douglaston in 1968 is well-documented, including the split between Cathedral College and Cathedral Preparatory. The change of Cathedral Preparatory from a full-time school to a weekend formation program is not outlined in this collection; interested users may find material in the John Cardinal O'Connor Collection (open to researchers in 2025). Series V: Photographs contains photographs of every graduating class of the college from 1908 to 1968, with the exception of 1919, 1939, and 1943.

Processing Note: The arrangement for the entire collection was imposed during processing, as the collection was one that had been created in-house over a number of years. Once the order was established, material was placed in acid-free folders and boxes. Several of the graduation photos had been mounted on wood at some point, and the photos were impossible to remove without damaging them. The mounted photos were placed in an oversize box. Folder titles were assigned, as there were no pre-existing folder titles, and all metal fasteners were removed.
