Scope & Content Note

The Pamphlets Collection is an artificial collection, pulled together over a number of years from various unknown sources. The collection consists entirely of materials published in pamphlet form. While the majority of the pamphlets in the collection focus on nineteenth century anti-Catholicism and the Protestant / Catholic public school debate that occurred in New York City, the collection touches on a wide variety of topics ranging from funeral orations, to Catholic Charities, to World Wars I and II. Because the collection was created at the Archives, there was no original order inherent in the collection.

Arrangement

The Pamphlets Collection is an artificial collection created over a number of years by archives staff and outside donors. As such, there was no inherent order existing in the collection. The items in the collection are arranged chronologically in a single series. When more than one pamphlet existed for a certain year, the material for that year was arranged alphabetically by pamphlet title.
