To attend a Catholic high school in the Archdiocese of New York, your child must take the <u>Test for Admission to Catholic High Schools (TACHS)</u>. The deadline to register for the exam is Friday, October 23 by 5 PM.

While I imagine you are already planning to send your child to one of our storied Catholic high schools, there certainly are many factors to consider, especially amid the COVID-19 pandemic.
