

Dear Pastor / Administrator:

The Education Committee of the Office of Black Ministry and the Pierre Toussaint Scholarship Fund are accepting applications for the Venerable Pierre Toussaint Scholarship Program - a program of support and mentorship for college student-leaders from our parish churches. Pierre Toussaint Scholarships are awarded annually (through a competitive process) to high school seniors, graduating from Catholic, public or private schools located within the Archdiocese of New York. The scholarship is an award of approximately \$2,000 to be used in connection with attendance at a college, university or post-secondary educational institution of the student's choice; and may be renewed for subsequent, consecutive years of undergraduate and graduate studies, based upon the recipient requesting renewal consideration and continuing to meet certain specified academic and service requirements.

To be eligible for the Pierre Toussaint Scholarship, an applicant must be a practicing Catholic within an Archdiocesan parish or faith community, and obtain a letter from his/her pastor or parish priest verifying such. Candidates also must have demonstrated academic achievement and promise, and have exhibited good character and leadership ability in both school and church/community activities. Ultimately, in order to receive the award, a candidate must be accepted to a college or university and must have taken the necessary steps toward enrollment.

Enclosed you will find the **2021 Venerable Pierre Toussaint Scholarship Application.** Please feel free to duplicate the application materials and distribute to any eligible high school senior(s). **The application can also be downloaded or <u>completed online</u> at our website at www.obmny.org. Completed applications <u>must be received in our office or postmarked</u> no later than Friday, March 5, 2021.** Students who are selected will be notified in the spring, and actual awards will be made prior to the start of their fall semester in college.

We ask that you share and/or post this information regarding the Venerable Pierre Toussaint Scholarship Program with the students in your parish (through your parish bulletin, pulpit announcements, personal contacts, etc.) and encourage their participation. PTSF also provides scholars with ongoing mentorship and advisement: spiritual, professional career and personal.

To be eligible for consideration candidates must be an active member of a Roman Catholic Archdiocesan parish, be a graduating high school senior, show high academic achievement and submit the PTSF application form with the required documents.





A confirmation email is sent to all applicants when the application is received and when the application is rendered complete. Incomplete applications will not be evaluated. 2021 VENERABLE PIERRE TOUSSAINT SCHOLARSHIP FUND

APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible for a 2021 Venerable Pierre Toussaint Scholarship Award, an applicant must:

- A. Be a member of a **Roman Catholic Archdiocesan parish**, active in parish/community affairs and submit a **letter of recommendation from his/her Pastor or Parish priest**;
- B. Be a graduating senior from a Catholic, private or public high school in the Archdiocese (during the 2020-21 school year);
- C. Show high academic achievement/promise, supported by a **transcript and letter of recommendation from a teacher and/or guidance counselor**;
- D. Submit a **2021 Pierre Toussaint Scholarship Application Form**, by the required deadline.
- E. Submit an essay (typed) of approximately 300-500 words on one of the three topics that are listed on the application, and demonstrating a knowledge of the life of **Venerable Pierre Toussaint**. (Please note that Pierre Toussaint is NOT the same person as Toussaint L'Ouverture. Applicants who confuse this fact in their essays may have their essays deemed unacceptable.);
- F. Demonstrate good character and leadership abilities, both in school and in the community;
- G. Be available for a personal interview during the selection process should such an interview be deemed necessary by the committee.

The completed application form, together with transcript, letters of recommendation and essay, should be uploaded to the website at www.obmny.org and/or sent to the Pierre Toussaint Scholarship Office at the following address:

Decisions of the PTSF, upon the recommendations of the OBM Education / Scholarship Selection Committee, are final. Scholarship recipients will be notified of their awards during mid-spring and will receive them prior to the start of their fall semester in college. New awardees also will be notified of the date, in late May or June, for the Scholars Annual Weekend Retreat and a Mass with scholar families, at which ALL scholars are expected to be in attendance!

N.B. In order to receive the award, the candidate must ultimately be accepted to a college or university and have taken the necessary steps toward enrollment.

- 4. Please list academic awards or honors you may have received during high school or expect to receive upon graduation.
- 5. Indicate your career interests.

ESSAY

In an essay of approximately 300-500 words (typed, 12-font and double spaced), discuss one of the following questions or topics, keeping in mind that, although your essay should demonstrate some knowledge or familiarity with the life of Venerable Pierre Toussaint, it should aim to provide the reader with a greater insight into who you are and how you think.

- 1. In Matthew 20:28, Jesus says that: "the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many." With at least one concrete example, discuss what you think Jesus meant by this and whether or not you think Venerable Pierre Toussaint embodied and lived out this statement in his life. Then address how this statement is (or can be) reflected in your own life.
- 2. What do you think it means to be a "man or woman for others?" Do you consider yourself to be such? Why or why not? Would you consider Venerable Pierre Toussaint to have been such? Why or why not? Discuss, providing at least one example from his life and yours.
- 3. Many would consider Venerable Pierre Toussaint to have been a very generous and forgiving person. Would you agree or disagree with that? Would you consider yourself to be such? Explain/discuss, providing an example(s).
