Dear Pastor/Administrator,

October is Respect Life Month and in alignment with that, it is also **Domestic Violence Awareness Month**. During the pandemic there was an 8% increase in domestic violence. Why do men batter? Why do women stay? Domestic abuse affects everyone in the family, including growing children. Would you consider dedicating at least one weekend in October to inform parishioners about domestic abuse?

The Catholics for Family Peace Education and Research Initiative has produced many resources, including sample intercessory prayers, homilies, weekly features on the saints, including a 100-page illustrated booklet, A Guide for Clergy, Religious and Laity by Dr. Christauria Welland (with Imprimatur from the Diocese of San Diego, CA) to educate Catholics on how to recognize, respond, educate, and refer people who are experiencing violence at home. Other items include sample Facebook and twitter posts, 2016 Symposium Presentations, and a training course to learn how to respond to Domestic Violence.
