Sacraments and Grace

Unfortunately, if you and/or your spouse were baptized in (or received into) the Catholic Church, and you were married in a civil ceremony or under another religious denomination, your marriage (unless you received a dispensation) is not valid in the eyes of the Church. It doesn't have to stay that way, however: The Archdiocese of New York, and your parish, eagerly invite you now to bring your marriage into the Catholic Church! The process to do this is called *convalidation*.

Your family life may be going just fine, and your marriage may be satisfying, but there is a tremendous beauty and strength in a Catholic and sacramental marriage that we encourage you to explore. As spouses, you can enter into a deeper and more grace-filled relationship with each other and with God by having your marriage validated by the Church. In the words of

Msgr. Joseph Giandurco, pastor at St. Patrick's in Yorktown Heights, "A marriage recognized by the Church, even after civil marriage, can bring great blessings to a couple. When God joins a man and a woman in marriage, there is a supernatural bond of grace."

Convalidation is a relatively simple process if neither spouse was married before. The first step is to contact your parish (or, if you are not currently enrolled at a parish, then the one where you currently reside) and make an appointment to speak with the pastor or his delegate. The priest or deacon who assists you will advise

you about any documents or other items you may need. If one of the spouses had any kind of prior marriage, be sure to discuss this with the priest or deacon so he can help you determine your next steps.

Convalidation is not simply the blessing of an existing union, but the true exchange of consent by the spouses before God, the Church, and each other. Prior to receiving the Sacrament of Marriage, you will need a period of preparation and spiritual formation. Your priest or deacon will guide you in the program that is best for you.
