

CURIA REPORTS JULY 2023

Administration [Frank Napolitano]

- The Pension Office is coordinating presentations for all priests on the 403(b) plans and investment information for August and September. In addition, David J. Lynch, vice president at Mutual of America, who is the dedicated representative for priests, is available for questions at 516.279.8132 or David.Lynch@mutualofamerica.com.
- To protect the archdiocese from certain liabilities, all outside groups using or renting parish facilities must execute a Facility Usage agreement and provide a certificate of insurance naming the covered location, the Archdiocese of New York, and the Archbishop of New York as additional insureds. In addition, Special Events Liability insurance should be purchased when an Archdiocesan facility is allowing an individual or organization to use its facilities for a non-sponsored activity, such as a christening party, bridal shower, wedding reception, etc. This provides \$1,000,000 in liability insurance for bodily injury and property damage for the special event user, the parish and the archdiocese. If a parish event includes the sale of liquor (admission fee, drink fee) to invitees or the public, a Special Event liability policy with liquor liability coverage and a state liquor permit must be secured. The current cost for Special Events insurance is \$100 per event (without liquor liability coverage) and \$175 (with liquor liability coverage and additional state permit cost of \$36). Risk management information is available to guide the parish when allowing outside organizations to use the facilities. Topics include liquor liability control, security and food handling. - There are currently 45 capital project RFAs pending approval with a total value of \$19.5 million. 20 new project submissions were received in June. The new project submissions primarily related to boiler work, roof repairs, and façade repairs at both church and school building locations.
- In fiscal 2023, a total of 116 capital project RFAs have been approved with a combined work value of \$44.2 million.

Archives [Kate Feighery]

- A new employee in the office, Denise Bergeron, started at the Archives on July 5. She will be responsible for managing and maintain the priest personnel database.
- The records from the schools closed at the end of June will be transitioned to the archives throughout the month of July. Once the records arrive, they will be sorted and organized to allow former students and employees to access what they need.
- The sacramental record digitization project is ongoing; we are continuing with the records of the other churches held at Transfiguration, as well as St. Cecilia/Holy Agony, Manhattan. The archives has launched an online portal to allow outside historians and genealogists to request assistance in searching for records: https://archny.org/ministries-and-offices/archives/genealogy/

Black Ministry [Brother Tyrone Davis, cfc]

- OBM is preparing for the upcoming National Black Catholic Congress (in National Harbor, MD), with a "delegation" of 35 persons from the archdiocese (including a number of our college student-leaders), and two workshops being conducted by members of our archdiocesan delegation. The theme for Congress is "Write the Vision, A Prophetic Call to Thrive."
- Also, during this month of July, the African National Eucharistic Congress will be held in Washington, DC, with African members of our archdiocesan congregation in attendance.
 For one evening, there will be a Unity Mass at the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception.
- Some Pierre Toussaint Scholars and Mother Cabrini Scholars will be participating in a special pilgrimage and service project to the Shrine of Our Lady of Lourdes and then to World Youth Day, in Portugal.

Development [Kelvin Gentles and Kathleen McGowan]

- As of July 5, the 2023 *Cardinal's Annual Stewardship Appeal* has raised \$18,337,100 in commitments and \$16,051,889 in cash through 39,666 donors.
- The *St. Joseph's Seminary* summer appeal letter from Auxiliary Bishop and Rector, Bishop James Massa, was mailed last month, and we are receiving gifts while also following up with past donors.
- The Saint Patrick's Cathedral Landmark Restoration continues to support preservation in this next phase of operation including the restoration of the organ, a garden reception area, and the enclosure of the entrance area.

- The Saint John Vianney Clergy Residence spring appeal was mailed in June. Tours continue to be planned and naming opportunities offered. Plans are underway for a Mass and celebration of the Residence's 20th Anniversary on September 7.

Ecumenical and Interreligious Dialogue [Father Ryan Muldoon]

- Father Ryan Muldoon will begin as the director of the office of Ecumenical and Interreligious Dialogue while serving as parochial vicar of St. Patrick's Cathedral, and while in doctoral studies.
- Met with representatives from the Combat Antisemitism Movement to discuss the troubling rise in antisemitism and religious intolerance of all forms.
- Participated in the Emerging Leadership Conference in Oxford, England, which is organized every two years by the Holy See's Commission for Religious Relations with the Jews and the International Jewish Committee on Interreligious Consultations.

Education [Michael Deegan]

- As the superintendent's office anticipates the arrival of the graphic novel on the history of the archdiocese, the office of Catholic identity will be creating introductory materials for the book as well as lesson plans for use in the Catholic schools.
- The office of school personnel is working with the schools to find jobs for the 34 remaining teachers affected by the school closings. Contractually, the schools have hired 33 tenured teachers. The remaining teachers must be hired before others from outside the archdiocese. Twenty-five non-tenured teachers have been hired, with 82 remaining to be hired, and at least 75 teacher assistants, administrative assistants, and custodians.
- The office of communications is currently focusing on Scholas NY media coverage for Scholas Immersion Week, aiming to promote and highlight the immersive educational activities organized by Scholas in New York through concise and engaging media coverage.

Ethnic Apostolates, Lay Ecclesial Movements and Community Outreach [Father Brian McWeeney]

- Father Brian will continue as the director of Ethnic Apostolates, Lay Ecclesial Movements and Community Outreach.
- Providing services to the Filipino community which is widely represented throughout the archdiocese and will be welcoming in the Fall a meeting of priests ministering to the people throughout the US.
