Administration [Frank Napolitano]

- The archdiocesan insurance program provides workers compensation coverage for parish employees through the New York State Insurance Fund (NYSIF). The coverage is mandated by the New Yor State Workers' Compensation Board and pays benefits to workers who are injured or become disabled because of their job.
- To ensure compliance with workers' compensation law and avoid potential penalties, all parish locations covered under the archdiocesan insurance program need to request a NYS Workers' Compensation Notice of Compliance Poster by emailing the parish name and full address to certrequest@bradyrisk.com.
- The Notice of Compliance Poster is required to be posted conspicuously in a common area at your location where accessible to employees.

- There are currently 38 capital project RFAs pending approval with a total value of \$18.0 million, and an additional 8 projects on temporary hold. In September, 15 new project submissions were received. For FY2024 (September), 11 capital project RFAs have been approved with a combined work value of \$1.5 million.

Archives [Kate Feighery]

- Overseeing the digitization of the paper files currently stored at 1011. The digitization team has accelerated the scanning of records and is currently finishing parish planning records and trustees of St. Patrick HR files. Over 200 boxes of digitized material have been moved to storage. Both the sacramental record scanning project and the document search for the CVA litigation are ongoing.
- Archives continues to be closed to outside researchers while the lawyers are working.

Black Ministry [Brother Tyrone Davis, cfc]

- OBM, in collaboration with GIA composer, M. Roger Holland II (also a professor of ethnomusicology at University of Denver and special consultant to OBM for liturgical music), is sponsoring a special choir workshop, featuring a new Mass setting by Mr. Holland and published by GIA Publishing to be held at St. Paul the Apostle Church, in Manhattan during the week of October 16, with Mass being celebrated on Sunday, October 23 at 5:00.
- OBM & PT Scholars are preparing for our participation (as Institutional Members of the Ignatian Solidarity Network) in the Annual Ignatian Family Teach-in for Justice in Washington, DC (in October).
- The Office of Black Ministry and the Pierre Toussaint Scholarship Fund are preparing for the Annual PTSF Awards Dinner (to benefit the PTSP), on Monday, November 6 at which time the Pierre Toussaint Medallion will be presented by Cardinal Dolan to Mr. Vincent Rougeau, President of College of the Holy Cross (in Worchester, MA). Development [Kelvin Gentles and Kathleen McGowan]

- As of October 10, the 2023 *Cardinal's Annual Stewardship Appeal* has raised \$20,177,692 in commitments and \$18,970,298 in cash through 42,212 donors.
- The *Saint Patrick's Cathedral Landmark Restoration* campaign continues its efforts to restore the Cathedral's organ and to complete the tented garden reception area. Both are making progress, and the event space should be open in time for the annual Christmas Concert.
- The Saint John Vianney Clergy Residence 20th Anniversary Mass and Reception was held on September 7, 2023. Cardinal Dolan celebrated Mass to commemorate the Cardinal O'Connor Pavilion opening its doors in 2003 as a residence for retired clergy. A joyful reception followed with donors, residents, family, and community.
- The Alfred E. Smith Memorial Foundation Dinner is sold out with 970 guests scheduled to attend on October 19. The Keynote speaker is Dr. Henry A. Kissinger, and the Happy Warrior awardee is Rob Speyer. The dinner has raised more than \$6.4 million to date the second highest grossing dinner in the foundation's 78 year history.

Ecumenical and Interreligious Dialogue [Father Ryan Muldoon]

- Participated in a USCCB delegation at the Christian Churches Together Annual Forum. This year's theme was baptism as a point of both unity and division among Christians.
- In the month of October, meetings/events are planned with: St. Thomas Episcopal Church (5th Avenue); the Episcopal Diocese of New York; the Eastern Diocese of the Armenian Orthodox Church; and the Rossing Center for Education and Dialogue.
- The national Jewish-Catholic dialogue with the Jewish Orthodox Union and Rabbinical Council of America is being revived after years of being dormant (it is one of three national Jewish-Catholic dialogues). Will take part in the OU-RCA dialogue, while Father Brian McWeeney continues the national dialogue with the National Council of Synagogues.

Education [Sister Mary Grace Walsh, ascj]

- The Office of Catholic Identity is currently working on professional development presentations for principals and teachers on making every classroom Catholic through revision of mission statements, exploring social justice issues, and encouraging involvement in the Eucharistic Revival.
- The Office of Communications and Public Relations will oversee media coverage preparation and assist with run-of-show coordination for the Fall School Mass and Tour at St. Theresa School to ensure a successful and well-documented event.
- The John and Daria Barry Foundation has donated an additional \$1,215,000 to the St. Philip Neri Catholic Education and Family Center to renovate four additional classrooms and create a science laboratory. Planning will begin immediately, and construction will be completed during the summer of 2024.

- First Annual Family Life Leaders Recognition Gathering on Saturday, January 6, 2024, at St. Joseph Seminary from 4:00 to 7:00. This Mass, celebrated by Bishop Bonnici, awards presentation, and refreshments will recognize parish family life leaders (clergy and laity) who demonstrate a focus on responding to concrete realities of family life. In the USCCB document *Called to the Joy of Love*, the bishops remind us that we need to recognize and encourage men and women of faith called to "...reach out and heal wounds in all families..." Pastors and administrators are asked to consider nominating one or more volunteers or staff from the parish to receive this recognition. - Continues to identify family life leaders in the parishes of the archdiocese. This

Finance [Bill Whiston]

- The year-end preparation of the financial statements and audit deliverables continues as KPMG has begun interim testing relating to the audits of archdiocesan service entities for fiscal year 2023.
- The approved FY2024 budget includes significant cost reductions from the FY2023 budget in an effort to improve the archdiocese's ongoing liquidity through additional

- revenue generation activities and cost saving actions to help offset the long-term effects of the pandemic and other expenses.
- Fiscal Year 2023 ended on August 31. Parish entities are obligated to submit their financial statements for FY2023 to the archdiocese by October 31.
- Resurrection Cemetery, Staten Island has successfully installed two new banks of glass and granite fronted niches for the burial of cremated remains. Over 20% of the spaces were sold in the first two weeks of pre- installation.
- A new Mausoleum will be constructed at Gate of Heaven Cemetery, Hawthorne. We have begun the design review and permit approvals are underway.
- A New Section at Calvary Cemetery, Queens for 335 in-ground plots are opened and actively being sold for full body burial.
- Calvary and Allied cemeteries will be celebrating All Souls Day Masses at our cemeteries Thursday, November 2. Cardinal Dolan will celebrate our All Souls Day Mass at the Gate of Heaven Cemetery at 10:30.
