Marriage and Family

Grades 4-6

Goal: Students will learn that marriage and family are a vital and important part of our society and our

faith.

Questions for Discussion

What happened at the wedding that needed Jesus' attention?

What did Jesus do that was a miracle?

Why do you think Jesus chose a wedding to be the place of his first miracle?

(Jesus wanted to begin His ministry at a wedding to show us that His mission, like the mission of this newly married couple, is a mission of love. This couple is giving their whole lives to each other. Jesus came to give Himself totally to us.)

Through marriage, God calls a husband and wife to form a family. The family is also called the "domestic church" because we are meant to learn about our faith and God's love through the love in our families. Though our homes and families are not perfect, they are sacred places. God desires to be close to us not only when we go to church on Sunday but also in the domestic church of our homes and families.

Questions for Discussion

What does it mean to "be the Church in the world"? How can your family use your gifts to serve

others and share the faith?

How would seeing your home as a sacred place change the way you speak, act, and treat your family

members?

Why is the domestic church important?

Activity: Have the students create a "Domestic Church Bulletin" about their family (modelled on a

classic church bulletin). It can include announcements about upcoming family events (a family wedding, family game night), prayer intentions for their family, a "staff list" (with various

duties/responsibilities each person in the family has).

Questions for Discussion

How is the Sullivan family living as a domestic church?

What do you think are some of the challenges of having a big family? What are some of the joys?
