A LESSON ON MARRIAGE AND FAMILY

GRADES 7-9 - Marriage - Lesson II (Year I, Day 4)

Goal: Marriage and family are a vital and important part of our society. Marriage numbers are decreasing around the world and there is much confusion about the nature of marriage and why people even ought to get married. Students will explore the benefits of marriage for individuals and society and learn how to have a fruitful marriage.

Lesson: In marriage, Jesus calls spouses to a love that is free, faithful, full, and fruitful. Faithful love says, "I'll love you forever, no matter what." Free love says, "I choose to love you." Full love says, "I love you with my whole self." Fruitful love says, "I want to share our love with children, in a family." In popular culture, the true love and hardship of marriage is rarely discussed. Giving the students an open opportunity to communicate what they understand about marriage can help them learn together all the blessings that marriage can bring.
