

Dear brothers and sisters in Christ,

With great sadness the Church mourns the death of Pope Francis. From the very beginning of his pontificate, our Holy Father joyfully proclaimed the Gospel of God's merciful love, inviting the Church and the world to receive that mercy and to become its witnesses through personal accompaniment. He reminded the Church that she lives and works by listening and dialogue and for three years led her through a global process of synodality. In his personal care for the poor, the vulnerable, and those on the margins and peripheries of society, Francis embodied the Gospel's command to identify with and to serve the least of Christ's brothers and sisters (Mt 25:40), and through his teaching and action on integral ecology, he testified to the ways that all are called to care for humanity's common home. In the years to come, his service in the Chair of Peter will continue to nourish the unity of believers in faith and communion and to awaken the hearing of faith in all people of good will.

The Secretariat of Divine Worship of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops has prepared this resource in English and Spanish to assist dioceses, parishes, and other groups as they pray for the repose of our late Holy Father, for the election of his successor, and for the new Pope following his election. Each section contains notes for Mass, the Liturgy of the Hours, and devotional prayer, including orations from the *Roman Missal*, homily suggestions, and sample petitions for the Universal Prayer. During this time of grief and transition, prayer in common strengthens faith, stirs up hope, and enkindles charity.

May God grant eternal rest to our late Supreme Pontiff, Francis, and let perpetual light shine upon him. May his soul and the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace.



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LITURGICAL NOTES

Upon News of the Pope's Death

Upon the death of the Pope, the Diocesan Bishop should contact all the parishes and parochial schools asking for immediate prayers for the deceased Pontiff. The custom of praying the *Our Father*, *Hail Mary* and *Glory Be* throughout the day is to be encouraged, especially with school children, as is the recitation of the Rosary for the repose of his soul. The prayer *Eternal Rest* is also appropriate.

Decoration of the Church

In an appropriate place in the church, a fitting picture of the deceased Pontiff may be discreetly placed on view. Black bunting may be placed around the picture, as well as on the façade or over the doors to the church. Church bells may be solemnly tolled to announce the period of mourning.

Memorial Cards

During the mourning period, memorial cards may be printed with Pope Francis' picture and a brief biography on the back, or the major dates of his life. One of the Collect prayers from the *Roman Missal*, given below on pages 3-5, may be placed on the card.

Novendiales (Nine Days of Mourning)

At the direction of the College of Cardinals, the *novendiales* ("nine days") are customarily observed as official days of mourning in Rome and throughout the Church. These may be observed in different ways in the various Particular Churches. In addition to the celebration of Masses for the Dead, bishops may encourage the public prayer of the Liturgy of the Hours, Eucharistic adoration and other

devotional prayer, lectures on the teaching and legacy of the Pope, activities for the relief of the poor offered for the intention of his soul, or other such initiatives. A sample novena will be made available on the USCCB website.

Liturgy of the Hours

Communities and individuals can pray the Office for the Dead in the *Liturgy of the Hours* for the repose of the soul of the Holy Father. Morning Prayer and Evening Prayer of the Office for the Dead may be appropriately celebrated for the deceased Pope using the Collect prayers from the *Roman Missal*, from the Office for the Dead in the *Liturgy of the Hours*, or from the *Order of Christian Funerals*, Part IV, nos. 348-395. In a public celebration a bishop, priest, or deacon could give a brief homily following the reading. A reflection on the life of the Pope may best be given after the concluding prayer and before the dismissal (see *Order of Christian Funerals*, no. 366).

Masses for the Dead

While there is only one Funeral Mass, both the Diocesan Bishop and priests in each parish may consider offering one or more Masses for the Dead for the deceased Pope. The Diocesan Bishop may offer a Mass at the Cathedral or in each Vicariate/Deanery. The attendance of as many of the faithful as possible is desirable.

Care should be taken that such a Mass be celebrated on a day allowed according to the norms of the liturgical calendar. According to the *General Instruction of the Roman Missal* (GIRM), "A Mass for the Dead, on receiving the news of a death... may be celebrated even on days within the Octave of the Nativity of the Lord, on days when an Obligatory Memorial occurs, and on weekdays other than Ash Wednesday or the weekdays of Holy Week. Other Masses for the Dead or 'daily' Masses, may be celebrated on weekdays in Ordinary Time on which Optional Memorials occur or when the Office is of the weekday" (no. 381).

Choice of Vestment Color

In the dioceses of the United States, the vestment colors violet, white, or black may be used in Masses and Offices for the Dead (see GIRM, no. 346e). It is customary in the liturgy of the Papal Household for red vestments to be worn for the Funeral Mass of a Pope in keeping with an ancient Eastern tradition and recalling that he is a successor of the Apostle Peter.

Prayers to Be Used from the Roman Missal

Various Prayers for the Dead in the *Roman Missal* include those for a Pope (forms A, B, or C). They can be found in the section, "Masses for the Dead: IV. Various Prayers for the Dead." Entrance and Communion Antiphons may be found in the Masses for the Dead. Although complete Mass formularies are presented, all the prayers and antiphons are interchangeable.

Collect

O God, faithful rewarder of souls, grant that your departed servant Pope Francis, whom you made successor of Peter and shepherd of your Church, may happily enjoy for ever in your presence in heaven the mysteries of your grace and compassion, which he faithfully ministered on earth. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

Prayer over the Offerings

We pray, O Lord, that through these devoted offices of supplication you may mercifully bestow a blessed reward on the soul of your servant Pope Francis and on us, your gifts of grace. Through Christ our Lord.

Prayer after Communion

Renewed by the Sacrament of our communion with you, our God, we pray, O Lord, that your servant Pope Francis, who served by your will on earth as the visible foundation of your Church's unity, may be happily admitted to your blessed flock. Through Christ our Lord.

Collect

O God, who in your wondrous providence chose your servant Pope Francis to preside over your Church, grant, we pray, that, having served as the Vicar of your Son on earth, he may be welcomed by him into eternal glory.

Who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

Prayer over the Offerings

Look with favor on the offerings of your Church as she calls on you, O Lord, and by the power of this sacrifice grant that, as you placed your servant Pope Francis as High Priest over your flock, so you may set him among the number of your chosen Priests in heaven.

Through Christ our Lord.

Prayer after Communion

As we receive sacred sustenance from your charity, O Lord, we pray that your servant Pope Francis, who was a faithful steward of your mysteries on earth, may praise your mercy for ever in the glory of the Saints. Through Christ our Lord.

Collect

O God, immortal shepherd of souls, look on your people's prayers and grant that your servant Pope Francis, who presided over your Church in charity, may, with the flock entrusted to his care, receive from your mercy the reward of a faithful steward.

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

Prayer over the Offerings

Look with favor, we pray, O Lord, on the peaceful offering of your people, with which we confidently commit to your mercy the soul of your servant Pope Francis, and grant, we pray, that, having been, in the midst of the human family, an instrument of your charity and peace, he may merit to delight in the same, for ever with all your Saints.

Through Christ our Lord.

Prayer after Communion

As we come to the table of your eternal banquet, we humbly beg your mercy, Lord, for the soul of your departed servant Pope Francis, that he may rejoice at last in possession of the truth in which he faithfully confirmed your people. Through Christ our Lord.

Homily

The homily at this Mass should highlight how the mystery of Jesus' victorious death and resurrection was present in the life of the Pope. The homily may also assist the Church to face this moment with great hope.

Theological, spiritual, and pastoral themes of the late Holy Father's pontificate may provide material for reflection. Pope Francis' faithfulness to the joyful proclamation of the Gospel, the stewardship of creation, God's mercy, and his constant care, concern, and outreach for the poor, sick, oppressed, and marginalized may be highlighted. Personal reflections and experiences about the Holy Father's virtues and life may be more appropriately offered following the Prayer after Communion (see *Order of Christian Funerals*, no. 170).

Universal Prayer (Prayer of the Faithful)

At all the Masses celebrated during the time of mourning after the Pope's death, petitions can be offered in the Universal Prayer. The following are provided as examples:

- That Pope Francis, called to the heavenly kingdom by the Lord, may rejoice forever at the banquet table of heaven. Let us pray to the Lord.
- For Pope Francis, who served the Church as Supreme Pontiff for 12 years, that he may worship God forever in the liturgy of heaven. Let us pray to the Lord.
- That the tireless efforts of Pope Francis, now called to the Lord, may bear fruit in unity, peace, and love among all men and women. Let us pray to the Lord.
- For Pope Francis, who proclaimed the joy of the Gospel, that the merciful Lord may accompany him to our heavenly homeland. Let us pray to the Lord.

Eucharistic Prayer

Any one of the Prefaces for the Dead (I-V) may be used.

During the vacancy of the Holy See, the name of the Pope is omitted at its usual place in the Eucharistic Prayer. The name of the Diocesan Bishop is to be said as usual:

- Eucharistic Prayer I (The Roman Canon): "throughout the whole world, together with N. our Bishop"
- Eucharistic Prayer II: "and bring her to the fullness of charity, together with N. our Bishop"
- Eucharistic Prayer III: "your pilgrim Church on earth, with N. our Bishop"
- Eucharistic Prayer IV: "all for whom we offer this sacrifice: especially N. our Bishop"
- Eucharistic Prayer for Reconciliation I: "in communion of mind and heart, together with N. our Bishop"

- Eucharistic Prayer for Reconciliation II: "and may he keep us in communion with N. our Bishop"
- Eucharistic Prayer for Various Needs I: "between the faithful and the pastors of your people, together with N. our Bishop"
- Eucharistic Prayer for Various Needs II: "confirm us in unity, so that, together with N. our Bishop"
- Eucharistic Prayer for Various Needs III: "and confirm us in the bond of communion, together with N. our Bishop"
- Eucharistic Prayer for Various Needs IV: "to perfect faith and charity, together with N. our Bishop"

The naming of the deceased Pope may be done during the intercession for the dead in the Eucharistic Prayers. It may be fitting to include the Pope's name from his death through the *novendiales*:

Eucharistic Prayer I (The Roman Canon)
 Remember also, Lord, your servant Francis our Pope, who has gone before us with the sign of faith and rests in the sleep of peace.

Grant **him**, O Lord, we pray, and all who sleep in Christ, a place of refreshment, light and peace.

• Eucharistic Prayer II

Remember your servant **Francis our Pope**, whom you have called (today) from this world to yourself.

Grant that **he** who was united with your Son in a death like his, may also be one with him in his Resurrection.

Remember also our brothers and sisters...

• Eucharistic Prayer III

Remember your servant **Francis our Pope**whom you have called (today)
from this world to yourself.
Grant that **he** who was united with your Son in a death like his, may also be one with him in his Resurrection,
when from the earth
he will raise up in the flesh those who have died,
and transform our lowly body
after the pattern of his own glorious body.
To our departed brothers and sisters, too,
and to all who were pleasing to you
at their passing from this life,

give kind admittance to your kingdom.

There we hope to enjoy for ever the fullness of your glory, when you will wipe away every tear from our eyes.

For seeing you, our God, as you are, we shall be like you for all the ages and praise you without end, through Christ our Lord, through whom you bestow on the world all that is good.

• Eucharistic Prayer for Various Needs I-IV
Remember your servant Francis our Pope,
who has fallen asleep in the peace of your Christ,
and all the dead, whose faith alone you have known.
Admit them to rejoice in the light of your face,
and in the resurrection give them the fullness of life.

During the Time of Election of a Pope

As the *novendiales* reach completion and the Church's official days of mourning draw to an end, funerary decorations in the church may be reduced and preparation should begin for the celebration of the election of a new Pontiff.

After the Conclave has begun, both the Diocesan Bishop and priests in each parish may consider offering a Mass for the election of a new Pope. The Diocesan Bishop may offer a Mass at the Cathedral or in each Vicariate/Deanery. It is desirable that as many of the faithful as possible attend. The Mass formulary "For the Election of a Pope or Bishop" may be celebrated (see *Roman Missal*, Masses and Prayers for Various Needs and Occasions, no. 4).

These Masses should be scheduled with respect to the guidelines of the GIRM and the Liturgical Calendar concerning the use of Masses and Prayers for Various Needs and Occasions:

- With the permission of the Diocesan Bishop, this Mass may be celebrated on any day except the following: "Solemnities, the Sundays of Advent, Lent, and Easter, days within the Octave of Easter, the Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls' Day), Ash Wednesday, and the days of Holy Week" (GIRM, no. 374).
- With the permission of the rector of the church or the priest celebrant himself, this Mass may be celebrated: "[o]n days when there occurs an Obligatory Memorial or on a weekday of Advent up to and including December 16, of Christmas Time from January 2, and of Easter Time after the Octave of Easter" (GIRM, no. 376).
- "On weekdays in Ordinary Time when an Optional Memorial occurs or when the Office is of the weekday, it is permissible to celebrate any Mass for Various Needs and Occasions" (GIRM, no. 377).

Entrance Antiphon

1 Sm 2:35

I will raise up for myself a faithful priest, who shall do according to my heart and mind; I will establish a lasting house for him and he shall walk before me all his days.

Collect

O God, eternal shepherd,
who govern your flock with unfailing care,
grant in your boundless fatherly love
a pastor for your Church
who will please you by his holiness
and to us show watchful care.
Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son,
who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
God, for ever and ever.

Prayer over the Offerings

May your abundant kindness favor us, O Lord, that, through the sacred offerings we reverently bring to you, we may come to rejoice that a pastor pleasing to your majesty presides over your holy Church. Through Christ our Lord.

Communion Antiphon

In 15:16

I chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit, says the Lord, fruit that will last.

Prayer after Communion

As we have been renewed, O Lord, with the supreme Sacrament of salvation, the Body and Blood of your Only Begotten Son, may the wondrous grace of your majesty gladden us with the gift of a shepherd who will instruct your people by his virtues and imbue the minds of the faithful with the truth of the Gospel. Through Christ our Lord.

The Mass readings of the day could be used, though it may be more fitting to use the proper readings, found in Volume IV of the *Lectionary for Mass*, nos. 833-837.

Homily

The homily presents an opportunity to reflect on the Petrine ministry, its role within the Church, and to instruct the faithful in the relationship between the local and the universal Church.

Universal Prayer (Prayer of the Faithful)

Petitions may be offered in the Universal Prayer. The following are provided as examples:

- That the Holy Spirit will inspire and strengthen the Cardinal-electors as they choose a new Holy Father to lead us. Let us pray to the Lord.
- That the College of Cardinals in its electoral process may be a worthy vehicle of God's grace guiding the Church. Let us pray to the Lord.
- That the Holy Spirit will work strongly in the next Pope who will be elected by the College of Cardinals. Let us pray to the Lord.

Preface and Eucharistic Prayer

"Masses and Prayers for Various Needs and Occasions: 4. For the Election of a Pope or a Bishop" can be prayed with a Common Preface, a Preface connected to a Eucharistic Prayer, a seasonal Preface, or any that is appropriate for the day. The "Eucharistic Prayer for Use in Masses for Various Needs I" specifically mentions "For the Election of a Pope or a Bishop" as an occasion for its use.

Liturgy of the Hours

Morning Prayer and Evening Prayer may be celebrated with the faithful gathered together to pray for the election of a new Pope. On days when a Solemnity, Feast, or Obligatory Memorial does not occur, the concluding prayer may be taken from the Mass for the Election of a Pope or Bishop.

Other Suggestions

The faithful should be exhorted to offer their private prayers, works and almsgiving for the election of a new Supreme Pontiff. The simple custom of frequently praying the *Our Father*, *Hail Mary*, and *Glory Be* for this intention is encouraged. The election of the new Pope should be prayed for in the recitation of the Rosary.

Upon the Election of a Pope

Upon the election of the new Pope, both the Diocesan Bishop and priests in every parish may consider offering a special Mass for the newly elected Pope according to the guidelines of the Liturgical Calendar. The Diocesan Bishop may offer a Mass at the Cathedral or in each Vicariate/Deanery. The attendance of as many of the faithful as possible is desirable. If it is the day of the election of the Pope or shortly thereafter, then the Mass "For the Pope" is appropriate, with white vestments (see *Roman Missal*, Masses and Prayers for Various Needs and Occasions, no. 2). This Mass cannot be used on the Sundays of Advent, Lent, or Easter, or on Solemnities, Ash Wednesday, and the weekdays of Holy Week.

Entrance Antiphon

Mt 16:18-19

You are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my Church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it. To you I will give the keys to the Kingdom of Heaven.

Collect

O God, who in your providential design willed that your Church be built upon blessed Peter, whom you set over the other Apostles, look with favor, we pray, on N. our Pope and grant that he, whom you have made Peter's successor, may be for your people a visible source and foundation of unity in faith and of communion.

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

Or:

O God, shepherd and ruler of all the faithful, look favorably on your servant N., whom you have set at the head of your Church as her shepherd; grant, we pray, that by word and example he may be of service to those over whom he presides so that, together with the flock entrusted to his care, he may come to everlasting life.

Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever.

Or:

O God, who chose your servant N.
in succession to the Apostle Peter
as shepherd of the whole flock,
look favorably on the supplications of your people
and grant that, as Vicar of Christ on earth,
he may confirm his brethren
and that the whole Church may be in communion with him
in the bond of unity, love and peace,
so that in you, the shepherd of souls,
all may know the truth and attain life eternal.
Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son,
who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit,
God, for ever and ever.

Prayer over the Offerings

Be pleased, we pray, O Lord, with the offerings presented here and govern with unfailing protection your holy Church, together with N. our Pope, whom you have chosen to be her shepherd. Through Christ our Lord.

Communion Antiphon

Jn 21:15, 17

Simon, son of John, do you love me more than these? Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you.

Prayer after Communion

Having been made sharers at the heavenly table, we humbly entreat you, Lord: by the power of this mystery, strengthen your Church in unity and charity and, as you have entrusted your servant N. with the office of shepherd, grant him always salvation and protection, together with the flock entrusted to his care. Through Christ our Lord.

Universal Prayer (Prayer of the Faithful)

The following petitions are given as examples that may be included in the Universal Prayer:

- For our new Holy Father, Pope N., that he may be strengthened as he embarks on his ministry of unity, love, and peace. Let us pray to the Lord.
- That our recently elected Holy Father, N., working together with the bishops of the Church, may build up the Body of Christ in peace and in joy. Let us pray to the Lord.
- That our newly elected Holy Father, Pope N., may be a champion of the poor, a reconciler of nations, and a force for peace and unity in our world. Let us pray to the Lord.

Eucharistic Prayer

As soon as the new Pope has been presented and his name announced, he should begin to be commemorated in the designated place in the Eucharistic Prayer.

Liturgy of the Hours

Morning Prayer and Evening Prayer may be celebrated with the faithful gathered together to pray for the newly elected Pope. On days when a Solemnity, Feast, or Obligatory Memorial does not occur, the concluding prayer may be taken from "Masses and Prayers for Various Needs and Occasions: 2. For the Pope."

Other Suggestions

Again, the faithful should be exhorted to pray for the newly elected Holy Father in their private prayers. The recitation of the *Our Father*, *Hail Mary* and *Glory Be* for the intentions of the Pope is encouraged. The newly elected Pope should be prayed for in the recitation of the Rosary.
