

The policies of our Safe Environment Program are designed to raise specific barriers to those who would pose a threat to our children, staff, clergy or volunteers.

As such, we would like to take just a moment to remind you about our:

- Archdiocesan Code of Conduct
- The Sexual Misconduct Policy
- And our reporting procedures.

These policies applyu throughout all Archdiocesan programs and activities.



About Our Electronic Communication Policy

- The use of a private email account to communicate with a minor is never permitted.
- Adults are permitted to have email communications with a group of minors, but only through an official email account of an Archdiocesan institution.
- Only matters relating to an official activity are communicated, and a proper professional relationship must be maintained at all times.
- The use of a private cell phone or text messaging a minor is never permitted, except if it is necessary for safety or during an official trip.



Let's Discuss Social Media

Adults who use social media (e.g., Instagram, TikTok, Snapchat, Facebook) may not "friend" or "follow" any minor who is active in their institution or program.

Private messaging apps (Messenger, WhatsApp, TikTok) are not to be used for church/school functions.

Adults must serve as examples of Christian conduct and should not post inappropriate or indecent material on social media.



What is artificial intelligence?

Artificial intelligence (AI) technology allows technology to simulate abilities typically ascribed only to human beings such as:

- Learning
- Comprehension
- Problem-solving
- Decision-making



These capacities allow applications and devices an arguable level of creativity and autonomy.



The Artificial Intelligence Landscape

Applications and devices equipped with Al can act independently, with no inherent need for human intervention. Depending on their software. They can:

- See and identify objects
- Understand and respond to human language
- Learn from new information and experience
- Make detailed recommendations
- Create original media
- In any type of format!

Minors are even more likely than adults to think they are interacting with a real person online when they are actually dialoguing with Al or viewing Al generated content.

Al voice bots take orders at an increasing number of fast-food drive-thru lanes.




The Children Need Our Guidance, So the Adults Must Become the AI Gatekeepers

The Challenges Presented By Artificial Intelligence
