Gaudete Sunday-Third Sunday of Advent

Mass Readings:

Isaiah 61: 1-2a, 10-11 Luke 1: 46-48, 49-50, 53-54 1 Thessalonians 5: 16-24 John 1: 7-8, 19-28

Discuss

After reading the Sunday readings, discuss as a family:

- 1. Some thought the Messiah was going to be a powerful military ruler, but in the first reading what kind of person is the Messiah? How are these images different from each other?
- 2. The second reading asks us to "Rejoice always!" What are ways we can do that?
- 3. How can we have hearts full of joy even in the tough times?

Share

Next week is the longest night of the year (December 21). Sometimes in the darkness it is hard to remember that we are indeed surrounded by Light! The Light of Jesus. Gaudete Sunday – Rejoice Sunday – reminds us to "rejoice always" and our spirits "rejoice in God our Savior!"

Watch

Pray

Light the pink candle on your Advent wreath and pray: Pray the Psalm together. This week it is the Magnificat—Mary's prayer of praise to God.

Do

Create your own prayers of rejoicing! On a sheet of paper write from the Magnificat:

My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord. My spirit rejoices in God, my savior... The Almighty has done great things for me and holy is His Name! He has...

Then write all the things God has done for you, such as given you a family, made the beautiful sunset, given you loving grandparents, etc.
