Saints of December.

This month is chock full of great Saints to remember and great feasts to celebrate.

December 3. **Saint Francis Xavier** was won over to Christ by the gentle persuasion of Saint Ignatius of Loyola.

December 4—**St. John Damascene**—Born in Damascus, John spent most of his life in the Monastery of Saint Sabas near Jerusalem, and all of his life under Muslim rule, John defended the Church's understanding of the veneration of images .

December 7—**St. Ambrose**— a man steeped in the learning, law, and culture of the ancients and of his contemporaries. Patron Saint of Bee keepers, Beggars, Learning, Milan

December 8—**The Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary** - see page 2

December 9—**St Juan Diego**—see page 2

December 12—**Our Lady of Guadalupe**—see page 2

December 14—**St. John of the Cross**- John is a saint because his life was a heroic effort to live up to his name: "of the Cross." "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me" (Mark 8:34) John was a reformer, mystic-poet, and theologian-priest. 1537 A.D.

December 25—**Celebration of the Incarnation** (the birthday of Jesus) - see page 3

December 26—**St. Stephen**-One of the first deacons and the first Christian martyr. Stephen was filled with grace and power and worked great wonders among the people.

December 27—**Feast of the Holy Family**-Today is the feast day of the Holy Family, but also every family's feast day, since the Holy Family is the patron and model of all Christian families. Today should be a huge family feast, since it is devoted entirely to the Holy Family as a model for the Christian family life. Catholicculture.org

December 28—**Feast of the Holy Innocents**-Christian feast in remembrance of the massacre of young children in Bethlehem by King Herod the Great in his attempt to kill the infant Jesus (Matthew 2:16-18).

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The Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary—December 8

If you were given a saint's name at Baptism, that saint is your patron saint. Countries also have patron saints. Who is the patron saint of the United States? If you answered, "Mary, the mother of Jesus," you are correct. The title of the Immaculate Conception recognizes Mary's privilege of coming into the world free from sin. Through the power of Jesus' Death and Resurrection, every human being can be freed from sin at Baptism. Through that same power, Mary was always free from sin, even from that very first moment of life.

St. Juan Diego—December 9

Thousands of people gathered in the Basilica of Our Lady of Guadalupe July 31, 2002, for the canonization of Juan Diego, to whom the Blessed Mother appeared in the 16th century. Pope John Paul II celebrated the ceremony at which the poor Indian peasant became the Church's first saint indigenous to the Americas.

First called *Cuauhtlatohuac* ("The eagle who speaks"), Juan Diego's name is forever linked with Our Lady of Guadalupe because it was to him that she first appeared at Tepeyac hill on December 9, 1531. The most famous part of his story is told in connection with the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe on December 12. The roses gathered in his tilma were transformed into the miraculous image of Our Lady.

God counted on Juan Diego to play a humble, yet huge role in bringing the Good News to the peoples of Mexico. Overcoming his own fear and the doubts of the local Bishop, Juan Diego cooperated with God's grace in showing his people that the Good News of Jesus is for everyone.
