Mass Readings:

Sirach 3: 2-6, 12-14 Psalm 128: 1-2, 3, 4-5 Colossians 3: 12-21 Luke 2: 22-40

Discuss

After reading the Sunday readings, discuss as a family:

1. The first two readings and the responsorial psalm are filled with the Lord's prescriptions for building a happy family. What are some of the ways God calls us to be for each other in our family?

- 2. When we follow the Lord's way for us in our family, He makes us many promises. What are some of those promises?
- 3. In the Gospel, we hear of the presentation of Jesus in the temple. Our Tradition tells us that this moment was Mary's great joy but also her great sorrow. Why was Mary joyful? Why was Mary sorrowful?
