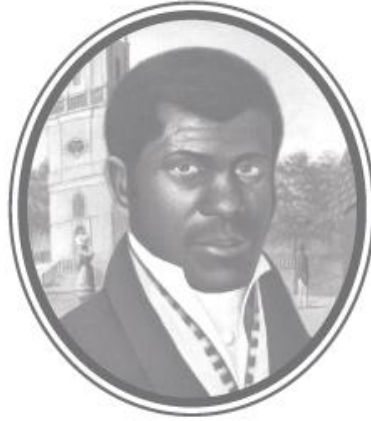

The Pierre Toussaint Scholarship Fund and Program (PTSP) were established in 1983 and are administered by the Archdiocese of New York through its Office of Black Ministry. PTSP is NOT a financial aid program, but rather a leadership and service program that provides support and mentorship to graduating high school seniors of diverse backgrounds from public, private and parochial schools throughout the Archdiocese of New York, to accompany them during their college careers and to assist them with the educational fees and expenses associated with their college studies. Students selected into the PTSP, as “P.T. Scholars,” are chosen based upon their strong academic record, their active participation with their parishes and school communities, and their demonstration of good character and sound leadership ability. Scholarship awards are renewable for subsequent, consecutive years of collegiate studies, based upon the Scholar meeting certain specified academic and service requirements, and other PTSP program requirements. PTSP also provides scholars with ongoing mentorship and advisement: spiritual, educational, professional career, and personal.

VENERABLE PIERRE TOUSSAINT SCHOLARS PROGRAM

2024 APPLICATION REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible for the Venerable Pierre Toussaint Scholars Program, an applicant must:

- A. Be a member of a **Roman Catholic Archdiocesan parish**, active in parish/community affairs and submit a **letter of recommendation from his/her Pastor or Parish priest**.*
- B. Be a graduating senior from a Catholic, private, or public high school in the Archdiocese (during the 2023-24 school year).*
- C. Show high academic achievement/promise, supported by a **transcript and letter of recommendation from a teacher and/or guidance counselor**.
- D. Submit a **2024 Pierre Toussaint Scholars Program Application Form**, by the required deadline.
- E. Submit an essay (typed) of approximately 300-500 words on one of the three topics that are listed on the application and demonstrating a knowledge of the life of **Venerable Pierre Toussaint**. (Please note that Pierre Toussaint is NOT the same person as Toussaint L'Ouverture. Applicants who confuse this fact in their essays may have their essays deemed unacceptable.)
- F. Demonstrate good character and leadership abilities, both in school and in the community.
- G. Be available for a personal interview during the selection process should such an interview be deemed necessary by the committee.

** Certain exceptions may be made for applicants to the PT-Mother Cabrini Scholars Program.*

Decisions of the PTSF, upon the recommendations of its Education / Scholars Program Selection Committee, are final. Accepted applicants will be notified of their acceptance into the program during mid-spring and will receive the scholarship award in their fall semester in college. Newly accepted scholars will be notified of the date (in June), for the **Scholars Annual Weekend Retreat and Mass** with scholar families, at which **ALL scholars are expected to be in attendance**.

N.B. To receive the initial award, a candidate must ultimately be accepted at a college or university and have taken the necessary steps toward enrollment.

3. To what colleges, trade schools or post-secondary training programs have you applied? (Please indicate if you've been accepted at any of the indicated schools as of the date of your application).
4. Please list academic awards or honors you may have received during high school or expect to receive upon graduation.
5. Indicate your career interests (especially indicate any interest in a specific healthcare profession or in Psychology or Social Work.)

ESSAY

In an essay of approximately 300-500 words (typed, 12-font and double spaced), discuss one of the following questions or topics, keeping in mind that, although your essay should demonstrate some knowledge or familiarity with the life of Venerable Pierre Toussaint, it should aim to provide the reader with a greater insight into who you are and how you think.

1. In Matthew 20:28, Jesus says that: “the Son of Man did not come to be served but to serve, and to give his life as a ransom for many.” With at least one concrete example, discuss what you think Jesus meant by this and whether you think Venerable Pierre Toussaint embodied and lived out this statement in his life. Then address how this statement is (or can be) reflected in your own life.
2. What do you think it means to be a “man or woman for others?” Do you consider yourself to be such? Why or why not? Would you consider Venerable Pierre Toussaint to have been such? Why or why not? Provide at least one example from his life and yours.
3. Many would consider Venerable Pierre Toussaint to have been a very generous and forgiving person. Would you agree or disagree with that? Would you consider yourself to be such? Explain by providing an example(s).
