

Overview

Catholic Charities continues to operate during the COVID-19 pandemic in NYC, Westchester, and the Hudson Valley but it's not business as usual - some school-based programs are suspended, other services are modified, operated telephonically, or remotely. Especially challenging and precarious are the residential services Catholic Charities operates for people with developmental disabilities, seniors, the homeless, the mentally ill, or those with substance abuse issues - where both staff and clients must still be in close contact. As we provide ongoing services in this "new normal", Catholic Charities is expanding and adding new services to meet the needs of the hundreds of thousands of people impacted by COVID-19 across the ten counties of the Archdiocese of New York.

Two open-invitation conference calls for pastors and parish staff were hosted earlier this month, where Catholic Charities staff provides updates on available general assistance and immigration related support. The enclosed documents provide further information and resources discussed.

2. Catholic Charities Parish Counseling Network

The COVID-19 pandemic has brought new challenges, altered routines, and created fear for loved ones. Some are experiencing substantial anxiety and a sense of crisis. Catholic Charities short-term counseling network is specifically designed to meet the needs of parishioners adjusting to such a crisis. Through telephonic services, therapists are available to help parishioners adjust to one of the most significant and troubling challenges of our lifetimes. The network has Spanish language capacity. Referrals may be made by pastors, or designated parish staff who call the listed number. The referring source will be asked to provide the parishioner's contact information.
