


Annual PTSF Awards Dinner - 2022












SEEK23 by Joseph Saladino '24

"You are called! SEEK23! January 2nd-5th in St. Louis Missouri!" I had heard all these slogans and dates from my campus's FOCUS missionaries since October. The missionaries were from the Fellowship of Catholic University Students (FOCUS) and they were talking about the annual conference of Catholic college students from all over the country. I had gotten to know the missionaries well and appreciated the invite, but why would I spend a whole week (and a third of my Christmas break) in St. Louis? I did not understand the appeal of listening to speakers I never heard of and going to daily Mass, praying, and receiving the Sacraments, activities I could very easily do back home. Overtime I opened up to the idea of going to the conference, and I thought at the very least I would get to travel and spend time with friends from the Newman Club at school. With that "yes," I was headed to SEEK23.

The two most impactful things I learned from SEEK23 were the vibrance of Catholicism and that learning your faith is a lifelong process that should be shared with others. When we finally got to St. Louis, the whole downtown was filled with students. People had traveled from all over the country! UCLA, University of Nebraska, Texas A&M, Florida, Harvard, and everywhere in between. Taking part in daily Masses with over 17,000 people, hundreds of priests, and over 20 bishops showed me just how lively the faith is especially with young people, and it is something I will not soon forget.

I also learned a lot from the speakers at the conference. One of my favorite talks was by Msgr. James Shea. He began his talk by explaining how Jesus is our advocate and how we often find ourselves believing lies that we are alone, our actions do not matter, and we are not enough. Msgr. Shea went on to explain how Adam, David, and Jesus disproved each of those lies. I enjoyed when he explained the stark

difference between living "for God" and "from God." When we live "for God" we often feel this pressure to achieve and only then will we receive blessings. However, when we realize we are "from God" we know that God wants to live with us and from the blessings we received we can become fruitful. Msgr. Shea alluded to the story of the burning bush from the Bible, the bush shined and glowed but never burned or withered. In a similar fashion God will help us through all our endeavors and will not leave us to wither and burn.

Once the conference was over I was tired, but very glad that I went and excited to tell people about my experience! I have been a Catholic all my life. I was raised in the faith, received the Sacraments, and had a Catholic education from k-12. I categorized the faith as a part of my life. SEEK23 helped me to see how vibrant the Catholic faith is and the importance of prioritizing my faith, a daily choice to live with love and trust in God. Not praying when I have free time, but making sure I have time to pray daily. The speakers, the liveliness of the people, and the access to the Sacraments and prayer allowed me to learn much more about my Catholic faith, my relationship with God, and my relationship with others.







This past May, I had the blessing of embarking on a pilgrimage to the Holy Land, a trip that had been a dream for me for as long as I could remember. I had always wondered what it was like to inhabit the land where so many key figures of our faith had lived and walked, and all of a sudden I had the opportunity to be walking those lands. I knew that it would be a remarkable experience, but I can say that it all exceeded my expectations in ways that I cannot even describe.

Each day of the pilgrimage began with the celebration of the Mass, where we would reflect on the Gospel passage related to the respective location we were visiting. We were accompanied by priests and missionaries that helped us with guided meditations, moments of prayer, and explanations throughout our time there. Our journey started in Nazareth where we visited the Basilica of the Annunciation, the site where the Angel Gabriel appeared to Mary and announced that she would conceive and give birth to Jesus. This was without a doubt my favorite location because of its beauty and prayerful atmosphere.

Another extremely notable part of my pilgrimage was our visit to the city of Jerusalem. Walking through the streets of the Old City of Jerusalem and making our way up to the Church of the Holy Sepulchre while contemplating the Stations of the Cross was a remarkable experience. I felt so many emotions that day – from an overwhelming feeling of joy and awe to great contemplation and sorrow of being able to pray at Calvary where Jesus was crucified.
