The Global Celebration

At the end of Mass on the Solemnity of Christ the King on November 22, 2020, Pope Francis called for a renewal of the global celebration of young people in the local churches in every diocese and eparchy. He also announced that, beginning in 2021, he would "transfer the diocesan celebration of WYD from Palm Sunday to Christ the King Sunday." The center of the celebration remains the Mystery of Jesus Christ the Redeemer of Man, as Saint John Paul II, the initiator and patron of WYD, always emphasized."

Celebration in the United States

The global Catholic Church calls this annual celebration "World Youth Day" to remind people that every year is an opportunity to celebrate and accompany young people. However, because the term "World Youth Day" is often associated with the major international event that has taken place every two or three years since 1985, we in the United States refer to the Christ the King Sunday experience as the "Global Celebration of Young People."

The normative local implementation of the Global Celebration of Young People should take place on the Solemnity of Christ the King in the liturgical calendar year (as outlined by the Holy See), it can be adapted to suit local norms and customs in each parish, campus, or community. It is highly recommended that the celebration take place within a few weeks prior to or following Christ the King Sunday to maintain the vital solidarity with the universal Church and the Holy Father.

And for all of us, O Lord, grant a willing spirit to walk with them. Fill us with the words to say as we teach and guide them, and give us the ears to hear as we listen and learn from them, too. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever."
